Acrylic is a beautiful material prized for its transparency and clean appearance. From time to time there will be some visual inconsistencies in the material that happen while shaping and joining it. In the process of heating and bending acrylic minute waves can form in the curved surfaces and joints. These waves are not obvious to the eye but in certain light and angles, this characteristic is sometimes visible. While joining acrylic pieces, minuscule bubbles sometimes form during the bonding process. These bubbles are infrequent and difficult to spot, and are an inherent part of the process of joining one piece of acrylic to another

Century inspects each piece prior to shipping and maintains a strict standard of quality for every piece of furniture. The noted inconsistencies that can occur do not constitute damage and instead are to be celebrated as the workmanship of creating beautiful acrylic furniture.

ACRYLIC CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS

For normal care and cleaning, use a very soft cloth with mild soap and water.

Rinse well and dry with a very soft, clean cloth.

Remove dust and dry dirt with a very soft, clean, damp cloth.

Avoid any cleaning product with ammonia, ketones, halogens, window cleaners, kitchen scouring compounds, aromatics and solvents such as thinners, acetone, gasoline, benzene and tetrachloride.

If the surface of acrylic is cloudy, use a car wax or other buffing compound to remover them. Apply the wax and use the supplied buffer to buff until the scratches are removed.
